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# *Open up Your Education with your Library*

Libraries in higher education help teachers to open their education.

This role is new and growing and tackles different topics. Besides the traditional tasks of the library there are many new activities in which the competencies of the library staff can be very useful.

Examples that you might not automatically think of are on the other side of this card.

In the Netherlands the University and Applied University Libraries, joined efforts with SURF (the collaborative ICT organisation for Dutch education and research) in a working group to further support teachers in developing open and online education.

The aim of the working group is to discover and develop new activities on open and online education and help (applied) universities to embrace open education. We do this by sharing knowledge, identifying activities, collaboratively specifying needs and supply, defining good practices, etc.
